Additional adult support in English lessons 12 x 1hr weekly	£5200	100% of targeted Y7 catch up pupils (9) achieve at least expected end of year 6 ARE reading by December 2017. Pupils will be expected to achieve year 7 ARE reading secure by summer term 2018.
Additional adult support in mathematics lessons 4 x 1hr weekly	£1800	100% of targeted Y7 catch up pupils (8) achieve at least expected end of year 6 ARE mathematics by December 2017. Pupils will be expected to achieve year 7 ARE mathematics secure by summer term 2018.
Homework club 1 x 1 hour weekly after school for targeted pupils	£500	100% of targeted Y7 catch up pupils achieve at least expected ARE secure in reading and mathematics by summer term 2017
