Dear Parents, Guardians and Parishioners,

It has been lovely to have our school back after months of Lockdown during the Spring Term.

The children have not taken long to get down to work with a huge amount of enthusiasm and dedication. Finally being able to talk and meet friends has been such a relief to pupils in all year groups.

Both this week and last week staff have worked hard to settle children into daily routines whilst at the same time ensuring that curriculum is packed with wellbeing, STEM, and extracurricular activities.

All pupils have received welcome back Lenten assemblies and carried out a range of well-being activities in form classes. Pupils have also attended 'The Year of St Joseph' assemblies with Mrs Gelson.

Can I thank all parents for your continued support over the last few months taking time to support your child's learning journey at home. We are thrilled with the level of engagement from pupils across the school. All staff are equally delighted to move from live remote teaching, to real day to day contact teaching, that we were all trained to deliver - which has far greater impact.

The engagement in our after school sessions for Y5 and Y7 pupils using DfE Catch up and engagement funding has been pleasing. Can I ask all parents to support this as these lessons are hugely important.

I am also delighted to see our KS3 pupils starting practical science lessons in our science lab now that we have returned the furniture and organised the resourcing of the room. This hopefully will be replicated in design technology and food technology in the Summer Term as guidance allows.

We are trying to reduce restrictions and the pupils are delighted to be mixing freely in year groups on the school yard and eating in the school hall together. We can only do this if we are seeing parents and pupils supporting home testing arrangements. This is absolutely crucial to the safety and success of our schools staying COVID safe. Testing will continue over Easter and we will write to parents about this next week.

Can I remind parents that Fr Christopher is running confessions weekly at St Mary's during Lent from 6th March from 4:30pm to 5:15pm and Stations of the Cross at 4 pm on Sunday afternoons.

We are hoping to resume Pastoral class Masses after Easter, with the children visiting St Mary's Church weekly until the end of the summer. This will be confirmed hopefully next week.

Celebrating the Year of St. Joseph

in schools in the Diocese of Hexham and Newcastle from March 2021 in time to celebrate Joseph's feast day on 19 March. The census is a count of all the people and households in England and Wales. It builds a snapshot of life, based on housing, facilities, jobs, transport, people's ages and the languages spoken. The first census was held in 1801, and has been held every ten years since then (except in 1941 due to the Second World War). The last census was held on 27 March 2011 and as it asks the same questions about everyone at the same time, the census gives a detailed picture of the entire population and how life changes over time. This makes it easy to compare life in different parts of England and Wales. The census matters to all of us because the information it gives allows the central and local government, businesses and charities to plan for the country's vital services such as schools, housing, transport and healthcare. Next week in school, the children will learn about the census as an important historical document allowing us to see how life in the UK has changed during the 200 plus years that information has been recorded. Each class will take part in a variety of art & design activities all linked to the census as well as learning about how living conditions,



CCTV


St Joseph's Catholic Middle School now operates a Closed Circuit TV (CCTV) system to improve security and ensure the safety of our staff, children and visitors whilst on site. Cameras will be located across the grounds and inside the buildings.

The system is set up in accordance with GDPR requirements and will be used specifically to:

- Maintain a safe environment.
- Ensure the welfare of staff and children.
- Deter criminal acts against persons and property.
- Assist the police in identifying persons who have committed an offence.

COVID-19

Whilst the number of positive Covid-19 cases being identified in our communities is reducing, those cases are only a small percentage of the people who potentially have the infection as many will not have any symptoms. It is likely that the number of cases remains high; the infection is still being spread; and we know that cases can escalate very quickly if the conditions are right and people mix unnecessarily, for instance by continuing to hold events such as children's birthday parties. With our schools now fully reopened, it is vital that we all continue to do everything we can to prevent the spread of Covid-19.



We therefore ask that you ensure you, and your children are aware of the current rules and guidance and that you know where they are at all times. You can only leave your home for essential shopping, or for exercise. You can exercise with your household or support bubble, or you can meet with one person from outside your household. Please continue to maintain social distancing at all times, including when exercising, and when dropping off and collecting your children from school. We would also ask that where possible, parents wear a mask when on the school premises.

Can I also remind parents that if you have to take your child for a covid test please inform the school that you have done so as we have to log this with DfE .
